



Your Breasts Are Three-Dimensional. Shouldn't Your Mammogram Be?

3-D mammography now at Rush Oak Park Hospital

With digital breast tomosynthesis technology, also known as 3-D mammography, images are taken from 25 different angles and are assembled into 3-D images. These 3-D images are reviewed by a radiologist, allowing them to see subtle differences between healthy and abnormal breast tissue.

Several studies have found that using three-dimensional imaging, as compared to traditional two-dimensional mammograms, may be more effective in detecting breast cancer earlier, especially in women with dense breasts. It also reduces the chance of being called back for additional testing.
